BEACON Principles

Bulging Brains Explain and Explore Complete task Own our learning

B	Bulging Brains can Bring it Back	Recently, a growing body of research has shown that the practice of remembering previously studied information (i.e. retrieval practice) is more advantageous for long-term retention of BRAIN memory.
E	Explain and Explore to make things Easy	'Knowledge is power'. Knowledge does much more than just help hone our thinking skills: it actually makes learning easier. Gaining knowledge is a continual process over time. Those with a rich base of factual knowledge find it easier to learn more — the rich get richer! The more you know, the easier it is to learn. Learn in small steps, by modelling, by following procedures, scaffolding and asking and answering questions.
A	Access Amazing vocabulary	Vocabulary is critical to our success. Vocabulary growth is directly related to school achievement. Vocabulary helps us to think and learn about the world. Expanding our knowledge of words provides unlimited access to new information.
C	Complete task	We apply previous and new knowledge, skills and understanding to different situations. We are encouraged to use our broader knowledge, work collaboratively, use problem solving skills and be creative. We should also be able to complete tasks independently and take responsibility for our own learning; we can 'overlearn'. Developing ourselves as independent learners, including where to look for help, is important as it helps us to stay motivated and improve our academic performance.
O	Own our learning	
N	New learning - how much have we learnt?	What have we learnt? How much have we learnt? What do we know now that we didn't before? Reflect on what we have just learnt, keep retrieving past knowledge and know how what we have learnt helps us in all that we do.

Year 6 - Local Study - The St Helens Pals - Autumn Term

In World War I, two main alliances formed between countries: the Allies (including France, Great Britain, and Russia) and the Central Powers (including Germany, Austria-Hungary, and the Ottoman Empire). These alliances played a significant role in shaping the course of the war and its eventual outcome.

Propaganda was widely used during World War I to influence public opinion and encourage support for the war effort, often by portraying the enemy as evil and barbaric and appealing to national pride and patriotism. These posters helped to create Pals groups of volunteers.

Pals units were groups of soldiers in World War I who enlisted and trained together, often made up of friends, relatives, and coworkers from the same town or community. These units were intended to promote camaraderie and morale among soldiers, but they also led to devastating losses when entire communities were decimated in battle.

The St Helens Pals were recruited in World War I through a public recruitment campaign led by the Mayor of St Helens, Sir David Cantle. The campaign encouraged men from the town and surrounding areas to enlist together and serve in the same unit, with the promise that they would be able to stay with their friends and colleagues. The St Helens Pals became part of the 30th Division of the British Army and fought in several major battles, including the Battle of the Somme in 1916.

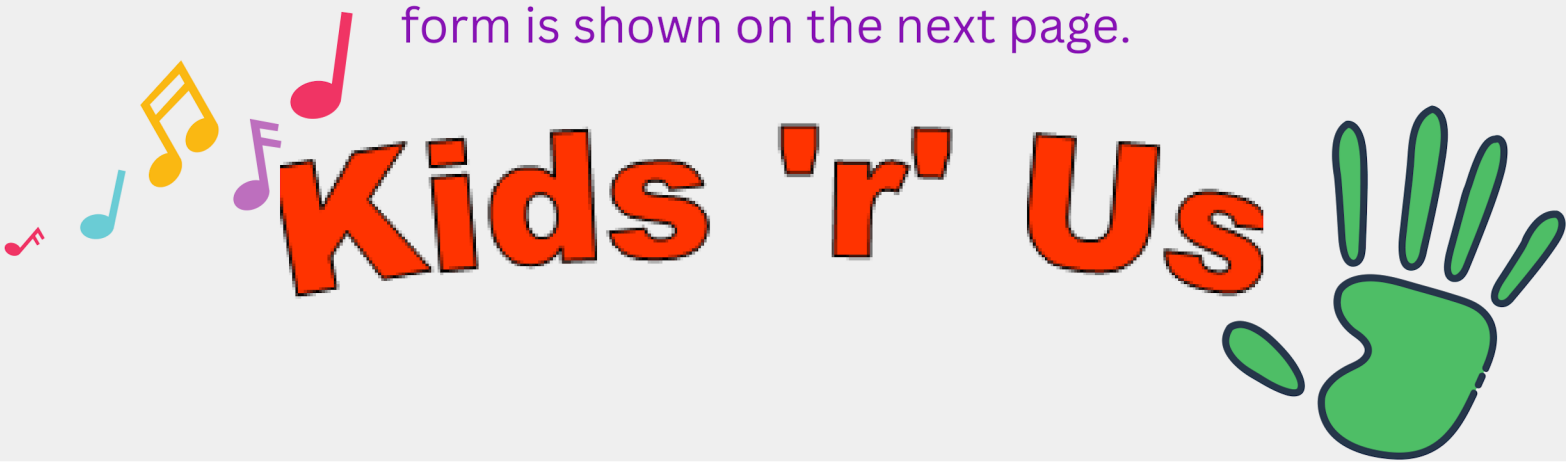
Costs: Breakfast Club - £4.50 per child.

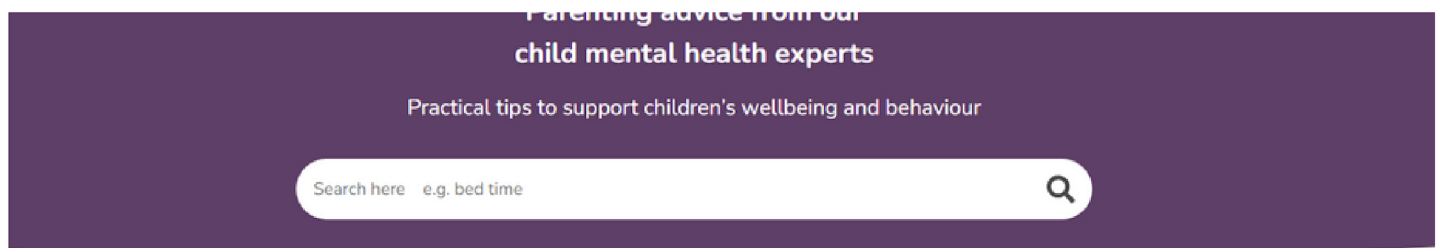

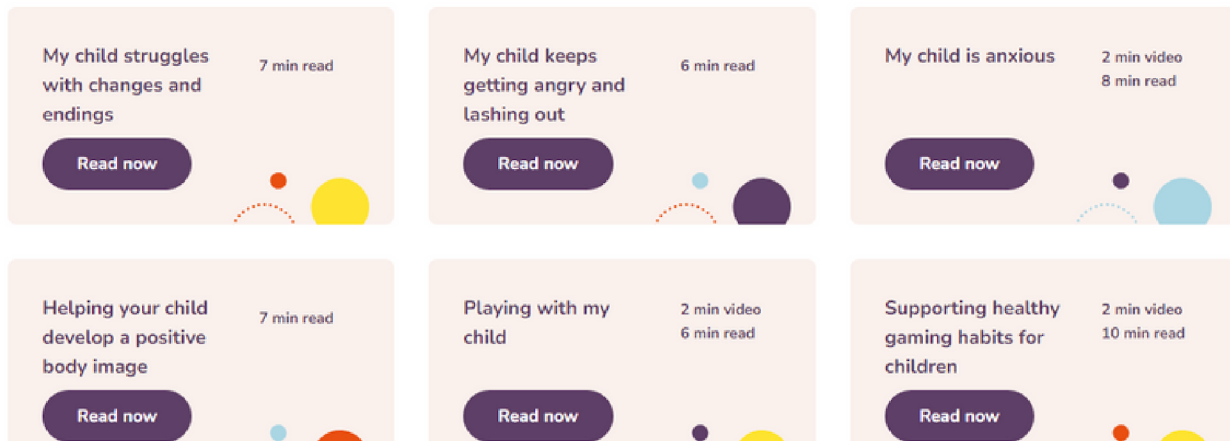

FLU IMMUNISATIONS

NURSERY TO YEAR 6

Dear Parent/Carer,

Your child's annual flu vaccination is now due. It will take place on Thursday 28th September 2023 in school.

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

The vaccination is free and is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, it is recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year.

Please visit the below link to access further information and complete your child's consent form even if you don't want them to receive their flu spray as this will avoid further communications from our service.

If you are unable to complete the online form, please contact our team who will be happy to help. If after completing your child's form you attend the GP and your child receives the flu nasal spray or wish to amend their form you must contact the immunisation team directly and not your child's school.

Applying for Free School Meals

Your child will be eligible for free school meals if you (or your partner) are in receipt of any of the following:

- Universal Credit and net earnings are no more than £7,500 per year (£616.67 in your last assessment period, £1,233.34 over last two assessment periods or £1,850 over last three assessment periods)
 - Income Support
 - Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
 - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
 - Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income, as assessed by HMRC, of no more than £16,190)
 - Working Tax Credit 'run on' - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

Once eligible, your child will continue to receive free school meals in primary or secondary school until they finished their current phase of education i.e. primary (Year 6) or secondary (Year 11). From 1 April 2025, if your child moves between primary and secondary school you will need to reapply for free school meals.

Pupil Premium

Your child's school will also receive additional funding if you are in receipt of a qualifying award listed above. It is therefore important that you claim free school meals and the pupil premium even if your child does not wish to take a school meal or your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and already receives an infant free school meal.


In previous St Helens Council have provided vouchers to parents to help when your child is on a school holiday. To be eligible for the vouchers you must be in receipt of benefits based free school meals.

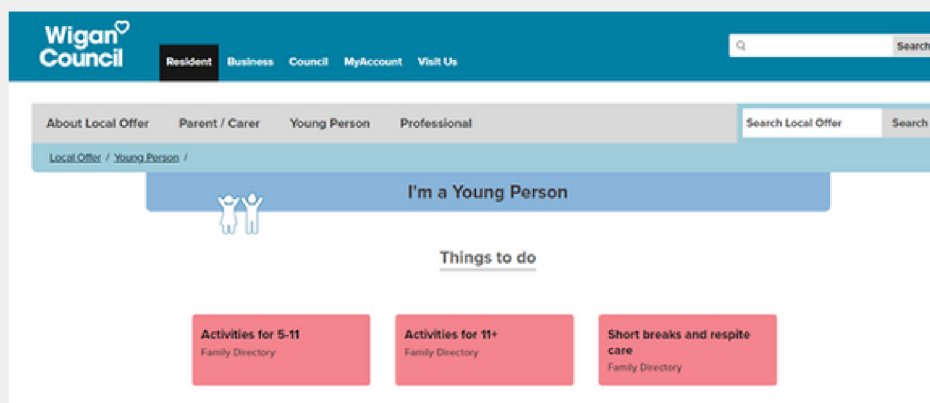

In the past they have helped fund the purchase of new technology, playground equipment and presents for children. As you can imagine the list is endless.


Each year, as our children move on to the high school we lose some valuable support. We would love to gain new support to continue enabling our children to enjoy the benefits that the PTA brings.
